

Purpose of Fellowship

Funding Goal: The **Creative Renewal Fellowship** is intended to reinvigorate experienced artists by offering the time, resources, and freedom to explore new directions, deepen their practice, and sustain their long-term creative vitality in Mecklenburg County.

This Fellowship is designed to provide a **sabbatical-like experience** for Mecklenburg-based creatives with over 10 years of experience looking to expand or re-invigorate their creative practice. This opportunity is aimed at helping established creatives **combat creative burnout** and **integrate new mediums/ideas** into their practice.

Up to 25% of total budget can be used to purchase new supplies/materials for work created throughout the course of the Fellowship, but the main focus should be to gain new skillsets/experience or experience with new mediums/ideas.

This Fellowship is meant to provide freedom to experiment and combat creative burnout by engaging in new trainings, learnings, and experiences.



Creative Renewal Fellowship

Eligible expenses:

- Fees associated to workshops, apprenticeships, residencies, and/or conferences.
- Up to \$3,750 in materials/supplies need to complete new work during fellowship.
- Flights or ground transportation.
- Hotel/Airbnb stays for the duration of your workshops, apprenticeships, residencies, and/or conferences.

Ineligible Expenses:

- Materials/supplies that go over the maximum allowed: \$3,750.
- Artist fees over \$3,000.
- Memberships for studio time or rental space for rehearsal/performance.
- Marketing and/or promotion expenses.
- · Addressing, eliminating, or reducing existing debt.
- Entertainment and hospitality, including expenses for activities such as receptions, parties, galas, food/drinks, etc.
- Prizes and awards for an event, person, and/or organization.
- · Activities that are associated with a graduate or undergraduate degree program or for which academic credit is received.
- Applications for projects that proselytize or promote religious activities, or which take place as part of a religious service.
- Programming or event expenses.


Focus of Proposal

"I'm feeling on the **verge of a creative burnout**, and I need space to reignite a new form of expression. This series of **activities**, **workshops**, **or projects** will bring me active rest where I can find a sense of renewal. I will bring this back to expand my creative practice when I return."





Eligibility



*Creatives working in an academic setting are considered eligible if the proposed use of funds is related to their creative practice rather than their academic research or work in the classroom.

Application components

Below are the main components to the Creative Renewal Fellowship:

Applicant Profile, W9, Resume

If you've never applied for an ASC grant, you'll need to create a profile.

If you've applied in the past, then you're all set.

2 Application Questions

- 1. Overall Intention with Fellowship
- 2. Creative vision
- 3. Logistical Information
- 4. Why pursuing this now?
- 5. How will you share about your experience/learnings?

Work Samples + Inventory list

Uploads -> Visual: 20 images

Literary: 10 pages

Links -> Performance: 15 mins

Music: 15 mins Film: 15 mins **Inventory list:**

- o Title of work
- o Date of completion
- o A brief statement of work
- o Your role in the work
- o Link to view or file name

4 Letters of Support + Budget


Two letters of support from a mentor/colleague who can speak to your **capacity for your artistic growth** through the activities outlined in the fellowship proposal.

Work Samples

Applicants must **upload or link** work samples to demonstrate the work created through your creative practice. Each discipline will have a different requirement – please align your work samples to these requirements:

Visual Artist:

Upload: Up to 20 images (recommended 15-20)

Literary:

Upload: Up to 10 pages of any work (one or two works)

Work Samples

Performing arts:

Link: Up to three videos, 15 minutes max (final stage or rehearsal)

Music:

<u>Link</u>: Up to three recordings, 15 minutes max (fully produced or rehearsal)

Film:

Link: Up to three films, 15 minutes max (fully produced or rehearsal)

Multi-disciplinary:

Upload/link: Split the requirements based on the number of disciplines.

Work Inventory List

Your **Inventory List** is simply the background information of the work that you're linking/uploading – this providing context as to what the panelists are viewing.

In a one or two-page document, include the following information of the work being included:

- Title of work
- Date of completion
- A brief statement describing the work or relevant background you'd like to share
- Your role in the work (choreographer, producer, bassist and singer, painter, etc.)
- If **linking** a work, include the URL to view the work (do not include your website/social media handles)
 - If **uploading** images/PDFs of your work, then this should simply be the name of the file that you uploading.

Example 1: Musician:

- You Give me Something
- May 2023
- This is a song that I wrote after meeting my future spouse in a park in Uptown. This eventually became my first single which then led to my first EP.
- I wrote the song and sing/play guitar on the track. Morrison James plays the drums, and Redding Otis plays the bass the keys are played by Blake James.

Example 2: Theatre

- Opening scene from the musical, Where did you Go?
- August 2024
- The is the opening scene from my musical, Where did you Go?
 This introduces our protagonist and antagonist via conversation filled with foreshadowing. Please view from min. 3:25 to min 8:25.
- I worked on the opening song, *Today, in this Park* with Miranda Manuel-Lin. I also worked on the dialogue with Mackintosh Cameron.

Letter of Support and Budget

Every applicant will need to submit **two letters of support** and **one budget** (*template is downloadable in the application*). The letter needs to be from someone who knows your work and the budget is a rough outline of all the expenses you'd wish to cover using the \$15,000 Fellowship grant.

Letter of support

Two letters of support from a mentor/colleague who can speak to your **capacity for your artistic growth** through the activities outlined in the fellowship proposal.

When reaching out to someone, let them know you're applying to this ASC Fellowship and briefly describe you're hoping to accomplish – I would recommend a paragraph of info, just to give a bit of background.

The goal of the letter of support is to have a mentor/colleague "vouch" for your ability to complete the project and the potentially impact on your creative practice.

Seed Grant

Nominate a fellow creative for a \$3,000 Seed grant

- In 2022, ASC launched the **Seed Grant program**, where the previous Fellows nominated creatives throughout Mecklenburg County for a \$3,000 grant recognizing their contributions to the local cultural community.
- Seed Recipients utilized these funds to enhance their own creative practices and submitted final reports detailing their experiences and learnings. Each Fellow is asked to nominate one creative in their community who is deserving of a \$3,000 acknowledgement for their work - all nominations will be awarded.
- If you are selected as a Fellow, you are charged with selecting one creative in the community that deserves this type of recognition.



Last year's Seed Grantees...

Each **Emerging Creator Fellow** will nominate one creative in their community that deserves recognition for the work being done. All nominees will be awarded \$3,000 to invest directly in their creative practice.

To purchase photography equipment to improve taking pictures in low light and movement.

This grant from ASC would be used to purchase necessary supplies, pay studio rent, and offset travel costs (airfare, hotel) for comic book convention appearances in the coming year.

To attend class(es) to guide me to the next step of style focus and the business side of art

To invest in the building of a collection of works to showcase that will include paintings utilizing different mediums.

This funding will help me procure a camera that is primarily designed for film making instead of one that is centered around photography.

Tips on Proposals

The most important aspect to consider is **how do you tell your story** and **what is the dialogue you are having with your creativity?**

Logistics are important to include, but it's not as important as your "creative why".

Please, send me drafts of your application!

Don't write fluff

Don't write for the word count, but consider it as a guide

Word counts vary from 350 words to 500 words – use these are "lanes" to guide your thoughts, but **don't fill the space with adjectives and repetition.**

Writing at least two paragraphs in each response is ideal.

Fearlessly describe your why

Every creative has a "why"

Panelists will have work samples and the answers you provide to understand who you are and what you're seeking to explore.

Describing your "creative why" sheds light on what inspires you and why you do what you do.

Dream big

Don't be afraid to go big – how would you use \$15k to expand your creative boundaries?

As Rick Rubin stated in *The Creative Act,*"Active play and experimentation until
we're happily surprised is how the best
work reveals itself." (Rubin, 78)




